LITTLE ROCK, Ark. (August 21, 2024) — In a bold move towards environmental sustainability, Goodwill Industries of Arkansas (GIA) announced today that it will discontinue the use of single-use plastic bags in all its retail stores across the state, effective September 3, 2024.

This groundbreaking initiative underscores Goodwill's longstanding commitment to the sustainability, safety, and beauty of our planet. By eliminating nearly 3.5 million single-use plastic bags per year, which often end up in landfills or as litter, Goodwill aims to significantly reduce waste, prevent litter, beautify communities, and safeguard wildlife.

"We're thrilled to take this crucial step towards a greener future not only in Arkansas but for our planet," said GIA President and CEO Brian Marsh. "Our customers have always been at the heart of our mission, and now they'll play an even more vital role in our sustainability efforts. By utilizing reusable bags, they become true partners in our journey to protect the environment."

To support this transition, Goodwill will offer branded reusable bags for purchase at checkout for a nominal fee. These durable bags not only serve as sustainable alternatives but also as a symbol of customers' commitment to environmental stewardship.

Goodwill encourages customers to start bringing their own reusable bags before the September 3 implementation date. This proactive approach will help smooth the transition and maximize the initiative's environmental benefits from day one.
